
Francine Rivers retells bible stories in a way that we can relate to. She gives new insight into scripture.

Jonathan: The prince whose humility led him to be riend the man who would


become king in his place.

Each story includes a six-part Bible study, perfect for individual use or group discussion.

Well researched and using her knowledge of life in the Middle East during the times these men of God lived Francine Rivers ably puts "flesh on the bones" to characters we see in scripture. The reality of the characters really helps the reader understand the context of their stories and brings them to life. It is a great way to gain some insight into the culture and mindsets of the day and to realise what problems the characters faced in their daily walk and how, through the love and mercy of God, they overcame them.
